

The Umpiring Pathway in Surrey

Note 1

Club Umpires stay entirely at their clubs and the training is either via an Introduction to Umpiring Course (run by SHUA at various clubs) or plain old fashioned self taught experience.

There is probably no need to join SHUA but initial membership will be free and there is insurance cover on offer.

Use of the SHUA website is encouraged to glean up to date information on rules and interpretations etc.

Note 2

An unassessed club umpire will have attended a [Level 1 Course](#) and is invited into Umpiring Course (run by [SHUA membership](#)).

This brings with it automatic plain old fashioned self insurance cover (anywhere in the world!) and is initially subscription free for at least 12 months.

After this there is a small subscription rate that maintains the membership and all its benefits.

SHUA members who are unassessed may attend our AGMs but may not vote.

Note 3

Completing the Level 1 process requires gaining on pitch confidence after attending the course. Progression is achieved by being assessed by SHUA on a club game.

This is an easy process once you feel that you are ready and you should [Contact SHUA](#) to arrange a practical assessment opportunity.

Note 4

County HUA umpires are available for appointments from SHUA to the various leagues (both men and women) that are played in the Surrey area.

All umpires at this level have to be Level 1 assessed and have also passed a membership assessment to achieve a Panel Listing within SHUA.

Panel Listing covers both men's and women's umpire grades and there are various interim grades that are awarded that reflect the umpiring ability to perform at the different levels appropriate to the league standards.
